"Ladies and Gentlemen,

...What are the lessons learned for those who have survived, or those who have not been directly confronted with war and terror?... One has to be aware that the ability and willingness to mourn, even to mourn collectively, is an inseperable part of mankind's dignity. This includes the ability to grieve for those who we do not know personally and directly, and for those victims who used to be former opponents in war. Mourning across borders is the strength that reconciles former enemies, and reconciliation has to be lived and expressed in different ways. One of them is the ceremonial way, as we do it today here in Hampton... Sorrow can and should be the beginning of an enduring commitment, an enduring duty for our generation... All the killed and missed Soldiers, the civilian victims, whenever and wherever they have lost their lives, commit us, now and in the future, not to kill and not to be violent against each other but to live <u>for</u> each other. Keeping this in mind, I kindly ask you all to bow with me to the graves here in Hampton and the graves of all those who have lost their lives in wars, violence and tyranny.
